ESCs now have a school closure list to see which districts in their region have reported as closed. This helps supports:

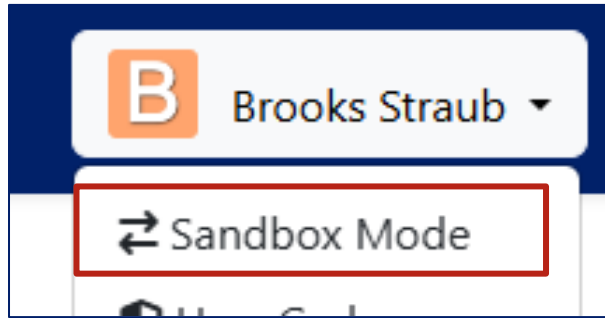
Enhanced Regional Coordination: Access to school closure reports allows ESCs to support districts in real-time by coordinating resources, assisting with emergency response, and ensuring continuity of learning during closures.

Support for Agency-Required Reporting: TEA and the Texas Department of Emergency Management (TDEM), require timely reporting of school closures due to emergencies, weather events, or safety concerns. ESCs having access ensures districts meet these obligations efficiently.

Proactive Technical Assistance: By monitoring closures, ESCs can proactively assist districts in navigating response protocols, adjusting instructional plans, and addressing challenges such as student meal programs or special education services.

Kindergarten Unit 8: Kings and Queens Leadership Guide

This guide provides a summary of the unit and lessons in the Kings and Queens unit to help prepare for classroom observations.

Unit Summary

This 16-day unit uses a variety of read-alouds, poems, and concept of kings and queens. Students will learn about royalty associated with royalty, and the advantages and disadvantages of being part of a royal family. The unit also includes ten lessons and a pausing point to review concepts learned. The unit is designed to take 60 minutes to complete. The unit also includes connections to social studies topics such as geography, civics, and government.

The unit's core vocabulary words are introduced gradually through words like “royal,” “kingdom,” “reign,” and “prosperity.” The unit includes work activities that focus on developing student understanding of these concepts.

Students will develop their oral and written communication skills through discussions, drawing pictures, sequencing events, and reading alouds. The unit encourages students to choose books from the unit, and suggests using the pausing point and culminating activities to assess student understanding.

Lesson Overviews

Lesson 1: What are Kings and Queens?

- This lesson introduces the basic concepts of kings and queens, where they live, and some of the objects associated with royalty (e.g., crown, scepter).
- Students will listen to the read-aloud “What are Kings and Queens?” and answer comprehension questions.
- Students will learn about the Tier 3 vocabulary word “rules.”
- The lesson concludes with students drawing a picture of a king or queen.

Look fors:

- Active student participation in discussions about kings and queens.
- Students using context clues and illustrations to understand the words “royal” and “rules.”
- Detailed illustrations that demonstrate student understanding of the concepts of kings and queens.

Lesson 2: The Royal Family

- This lesson focuses on the concept of royal families. Students learn about the advantages and disadvantages of being part of a royal family.
- Students will listen to the read-aloud “The Royal Family.”
- The lesson introduces the Tier 2 vocabulary word “advantages” and the Tier 3 word “reign.”
- Students will create a chart to compare and contrast their own families with royal families.

Look fors:

- Students making thoughtful connections between their own family experiences and life in a royal family.
- Accurate understanding of the vocabulary words “advantages” and “reign.”
- Charts that accurately compare and contrast the two types of families.

Lesson 3: King Midas and the Golden Touch

- This lesson introduces students to the classic story of King Midas.
- Students will listen to the read-aloud “King Midas and the Golden Touch” and answer comprehension questions.
- The lesson introduces the Tier 3 vocabulary word “treasures.”
- Students will practice sequencing the events of the story by arranging pictures in the correct order.

Look fors:

- Students understanding the moral of the story and the concept of wisdom.
- Students demonstrating their understanding of the word “treasures.”
- Accurate sequencing of the events in the story.

Lesson 4: Old King Cole

- This lesson focuses on the nursery rhyme “Old King Cole.” Students will discuss rhyming words and the characteristics of nursery rhymes.
- Students will listen to the nursery rhyme “Old King Cole.”
- Students will demonstrate an understanding of the Tier 3 vocabulary words “fiddlers,” “merry,” and “soul.”
- Students will plan, write, and illustrate a story about Old King Cole as a whole class.

Important Changes to TEA-Available Instructional Materials

Bluebonnet Learning

In November 2024, Bluebonnet Learning Edition 1 instructional materials were approved through the Instructional Materials Review and Approval (IMRA) process by the State Board of Education (SBOE):

- K–3 Foundational Skills
- K–5 Reading Language Arts
- K–5 Math
- Secondary Mathematics (Grades 6–8, Algebra I)

In May 2025, the Bluebonnet Learning Portal will be launched.

All Bluebonnet Learning instructional materials, implementation supports, and Bluebonnet Learning pilot programs will be available on the Portal.

COVID Emergency Release (CER) Versions

On July 31, 2025, the CER pilot instructional materials that align with SBOE-approved Bluebonnet Learning materials **will be removed from all TEA platforms** [e.g., TEA Instructional materials website, Texas Gateway, Test Delivery System (TDS), OER-Assessment Viewing Application (AVA)].

The following CER pilot instructional materials **will remain** available until submitted for the IMRA process and approved by the SBOE:

- Pilot Accelerated Math (Grade 6 and 7)
- Pilot Geometry
- Pilot Algebra II

Statutory Requirement for Removal of CER Versions

TEC 31.0721(c) states that open education resources instructional materials made available under this section may not remain available once amended or modified unless the material as amended or modified is reviewed under Section 31.023 and included on the list of approved materials maintained by the State Board of Education (SBOE) under section 31.022.

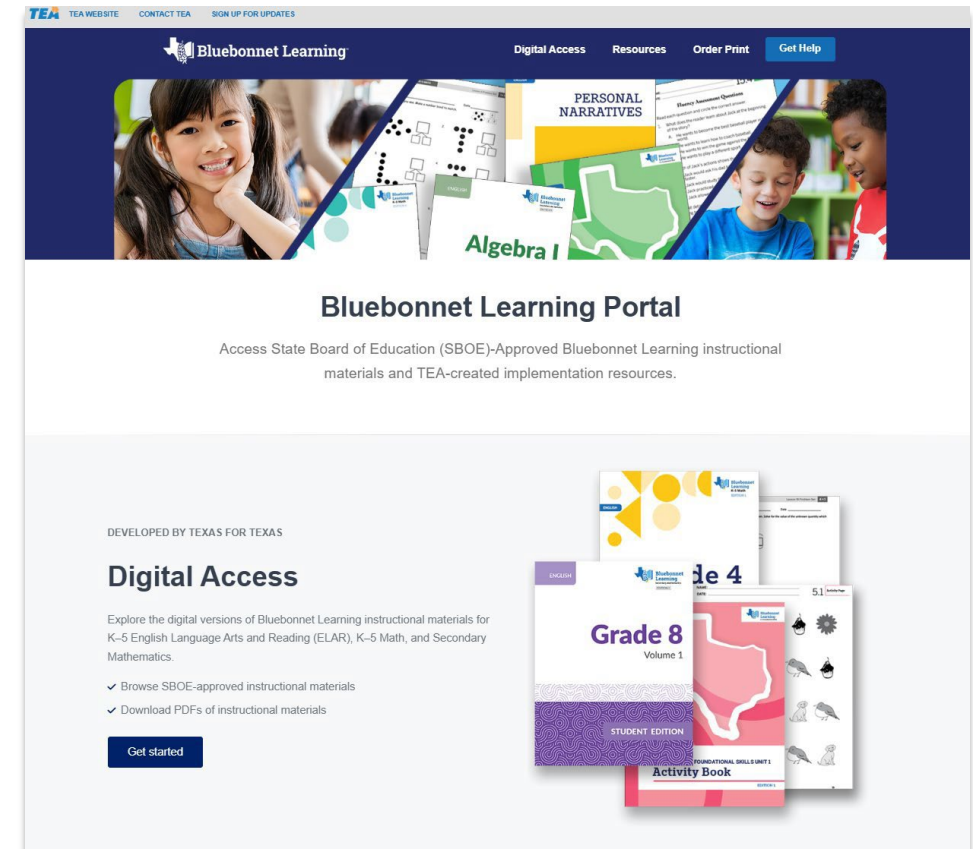
Bluebonnet Learning Portal Launches in May 2025

The purpose of piloting is to give school districts an opportunity to implement new instructional materials and provide meaningful feedback that can help improve the final version of the materials, implementation supports, and digital access as part of TEA's process of continuous improvement.

Pilot instructional materials are subject to approval by the SBOE at the end of the school year.

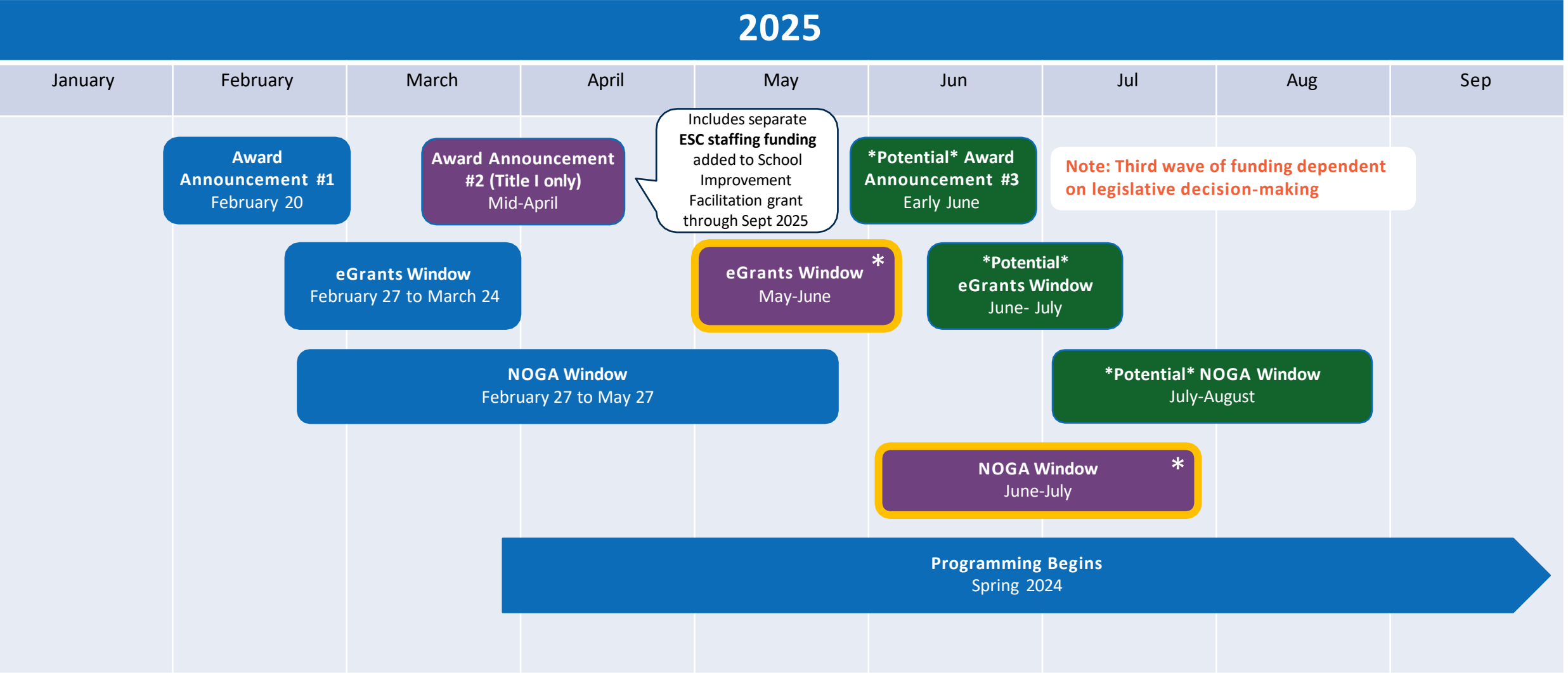
