- Special Education (0% Threshold): \$2,000 (HB2 increased Special Education CCMR OB to \$4,000)

Under Texas Education Code (TEC), §28.014, each school district must collaborate with at least one institution of higher education to create and offer college preparatory cour ses in mathematics and English language arts.

### College Preparatory Courses for CCMR Accountability Review and Approval

A comprehensive review of data from prior years produced a finding that most students who took and passed college preparatory courses offered under TEC \$28.014 did not subsequently successfully complete first year college courses. Because of this evidence, in the 2024–2025 school year, the Texas Education Agency (TEA) implemented a process to review and approve college preparatory courses that count toward CCMR credit within the public-school accountability system. This process aims to ensure that co lege preparatory courses, as defined in TEC \$28.014, align with standards consistent with other indicators of college readiness.

To be considered an approved provider of college preparatory courses that count toward CCMR credit in the public-school accountability system, course providers participate in an application process.

As of today, the evaluation results are available on the TEA website, and the agency has published the college preparatory courses approved for the purposes of CCMR in the public accountability system.

## TSI Readiness & CCMR

- English III and Algebra II EOCs do not count for CCMR
- Only Approved College Prep Courses count for CCMR during grade 12 (2028 accountability)
- TSIA, SAT, ACT count for CCMR OB Funding

TEA College Prep Approved List postponed. New implementation with Class of 2027 (2028 Accountability).

CPC providers applications will be open annually. New CPC providers will be added from those applications who have evidence that meets the criteria. Providers can only be added, previously approved CPC providers are not re-evaluated.

**TEA College Prep Approved List** version 1.1 will be based on performance data from the better of the Classes of 2023 and 2024.

**TEA College Prep Approved List** version 2 will re-evaluate all CPC providers using the most recent data and criteria then available.

## **CCMR Outcomes Bonus -**

THRESHOLD	AWARD
11% of annual graduates who are economically disadvantaged.	\$5,000 if the annual graduate is economically disadvantaged.
24% of annual graduates who are not economically disadvantaged.	\$3,000 if the annual graduate is not economically disadvantaged.
There is <b>no threshold</b> for the number of annual graduates enrolled in a Special Education program.  Graduates who were enrolled in a special education program count towards either economically disadvantaged or non-economically disadvantaged, in addition to the special education group.	\$2,000 if the annual graduate is enrolled in a special education program.  HB2 increased funding to \$4,000




